


## Pleasant Hall Street Lights

Adams Electric Cooperative has made a request for the Township to take over billing for the street lights in Pleasant Hall. Currently, Pleasant Hall residents are paying for the street lights as part of their individual electric bills. Beginning January 1, 2024, those residents will be assessed a street light fee on their annual real estate tax bill, and the township will receive the monthly bill from Adams Electric. This is a common practice in other boroughs and townships and is the method currently being used to pay for the Upper Strasburg Street Lights. A letter providing additional details will be mailed out this summer to Pleasant Hall residents who will be affected by this change.

## Community Center


